Hi all - thanks so much for your willingness to participate in the panel on demystifying academia. I will submit this mid-morning tomorrow (central time), please let me know if you would like to see an edit. I don't know who wants to discuss what topics and I can change the list of possible topics if you already have an idea. Trisha is a graduate student so might like to speak about that experience, Kristi is coming upon her 3rd year review, Jennifer is an Assistant Prof - I'm not sure in what year, and Nicole is an Associate (as am I). I also think we are a variety of types of institutions so that's great.

One question I have for you - should I change the title to end with "for women" so to only attract women. Or, leave the title as is, but include as I have below - the bit about special attention to women, but that our topics will appeal to all. It comes down to what and how you want to help demystify the academy. We'd get a larger audience with the title as it is now - but we'd have to make sure that we cover issues particular to women and also those that affect men too. Service overload is one that may particularly affect women. The mission of Women in the Profession is to help women so gearing it just to women is really an option I think.

So if you are able to respond to this - perhaps with a consideration of what you might discuss - let me know. Otherwise, we can tease out topics over the next weeks/months. These presentations can be informal or formal, can involve powerpoints or not, handouts or not, etc. Its really open. We can also discuss how long each should talk - originally I suggested 5-10 mins to allow lots of time for discussion but if 15 feels better, let me know.
