ATM: Located on the 1st floor behind the fireplace.

Awards Presentations: Friday, March 23, 5:00 PM, in Nicollet Ballroom A1/A2.

Copying, printing, computer use: FedEx Office is located on the second (2nd) level of the hotel (skyway level) and serves as a business center to guests. WELCOME

Thank you for joining us in Minneapolis-St. Paul for the 81st MSS annual meeting. Here you have the opportunity to explore and take advantage of a diverse array of formal paper sessions, posters, panels, roundtables, and workshops covering a broad spectrum of sociological research, teaching and practice topics. Some entries are sure to pique your interests and tweak your critical mind! Plus, there's a Special Event for First Generation students and a series of student participation events planned by the Student Issues Committee. This year, too, we keep alive the MSS capacity for fun and conviviality – the MSS Commons, ice cream social, Trivia night, and Welcome Reception festivities. Hui Wilcox and Erika Busse have put together an excellent series of tours/onsite visits!

Two topical themes have shaped the MSS 2018 program. The first is “Sociology and the Public’s Health,” with special attention to “Immigration/Migration.” We have two plenary speakers whose sharp insights address these topics:

- Amy Fairchild (Texas A&M Health Science Center) analyzes the ethical and constitutional dilemmas inherent in public health’s public surveillance to identify emerging societal health threats – “Beyond Privacy? – The World Health Organization (WHO) and the Ethics of Disease Surveillance”
- Cawo Abdi (University of Minnesota, Twin Cities) challenges us in her plenary to understand the conditions of millions of immigrants and refugees who are “stateless”– “Refugees and the Stateless in the Age of Globalization, Nationalism, and Fake News.”

A second and related MSS program theme is “engaging the community in which you practice.” In “Musings....” Vol 1:2 – Practice What You Preach!, I commented: “So...I took a road trip, went to Minneapolis, Cedar-Riverside, to learn more about this neighborhood...[and] explore with them whether and how they might be a part of the 2018 MSS program.” I came away envisioning that the MSS’ engagement with the Somali community and the Cedar-Riverside neighborhood could be a reality. Toward that end, we have a plenary speaker reflecting engagement with community...

- Sahra Noor (CEO, The People’s Center Clinics and Services, Cedar-Riverside, Minneapolis) draws our attention on the powerful need for bottom up/inside out access to health care in communities – “Engage to Empower: Mobilizing Somali Immigrant Communities to Promote Wellness and Prevent Public Health Crises.”

An exciting addition this year, a local band from The Cedar Cultural Center-Cedar-Riverside, will perform during the MSS Welcome Reception, Thursday, March 22...

- Harbi and the Great Dains (The Cedar Cultural Center) a local Somali musician Harbi collaborates with The Great Dains, a band made up of students from Augsburg University’s Small Ensemble Band, to delight audiences with sounds of qaarami (Somali jazz).

For those interested in sociological practice, we have a MSS onsite visit/tour with a local nonprofit organization, one of the NGOs selected to receive a 2018 MSS Social Action Award...

- The Family Tree Clinic (Minneapolis) whose mission is to cultivate a healthy community through comprehensive sexual health care and education.

Many, many thanks to the 2018 Program Committee for their good work, to the Student Directors and their continual vigilance for student engagement, and to those who contributed so much and weren’t even on any official organizing/planning committee. I cannot end without recognizing the amazingly effective and efficient work of our Executive Director – Jennifer Talarico – and extending a big thank you to Sadie Pendaz-Foster, our excellent Meeting Systems Coordinator who put all things precisely in order for the 2018 program book you are holding!

Midwest Sociological Society supports the ASA Minority Fellowship Program by sponsoring one Fellow throughout the year. We are proud to introduce the 2017-18 MSS-sponsored Minority Fellow, Rahsaan Mahadeo from the University of Minnesota – Twin Cities.



Rahsaan Mahadeo is a first-generation college student and current PhD candidate in the Department of Sociology at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. His dissertation is titled “Transgressive Temporalities: How Racially Marginalized Youth in Urban Space Make Sense of Time.” Drawing on data from in-person interviews and ethnographic methods, his research explores and shows how time is racialized and how race is temporalized. Rahsaan also explores how race, racialization, and racism condition youth’s perspectives on time. All of this research is done with a central aim to bring sociology up to speed and up to date with the temporalities of those consistently subjected to academic racism and neglected within time. Rahsaan is a 2013 Ford Foundation Pre-doctoral Fellow. In addition to his studies, Rahsaan is a member of Whose Diversity? and Differences Organized! (Do!)—collectives of undergraduate and graduate students committed advancing several demands on behalf of multiply-marginalized students. Prior to beginning his graduate studies, Rahsaan spent over seven years working as a social worker in Providence and Boston. In all his endeavors—including research, teaching, and service/leadership—Rahsaan demonstrates an enduring commitment to building community and working for justice.

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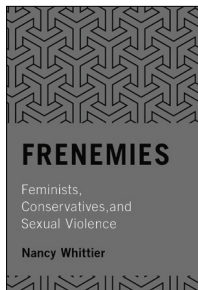


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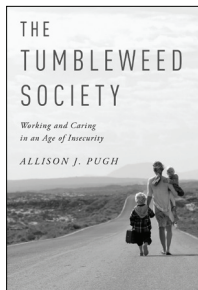
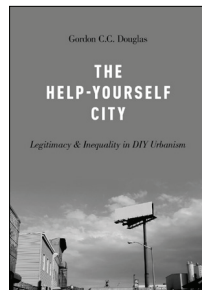
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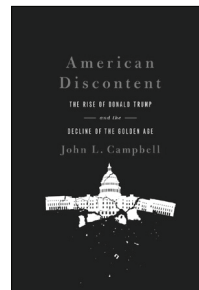


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
