Sorry for the delay in replying; I've been trying to clean up my clinical backlog [now caught up!] as well make some dents into the various talks/papers on my plate right now. We've had interesting prairie weather with a gratuitous 9 inches of snow last week (that at least melted quickly)

I was thinking of replicating the study that we cited regarding gender and its use in the literature in liver disease as well as some areas of GI as an initial study and then potentially as future directions, start doing some qualitative interviews after the initial project which might lend itself well to a grant.
